INTRODUCTION

At the beginning, we emphasize that in 2023, the Council adopted the ten-year analytical report (2014-2023) on the characteristic criminal offences of the Inter-Institutional Tracking Mechanism (MPN), including the following recommendations:

- Removal of four (4) criminal offences from the group of Drugs in the 'MPN'. They're removed
- Removal of the acronym EPK from the list of submitting entities of criminal reports,
- Inclusion in the report of data on the number of dismissed criminal reports due to the mediation agreement, Article 229 of the Criminal Code of Kosovo.
- Inclusion in the report of data on the number of appeals rejected by the Court of Appeal,
- Inclusion in the report of data on the number of closed cases in the PPN registry which have been CARRIED to the PP registry.
- Inclusion in the report of data on the number of PP registry cases which have been CARRIED from the PPN registry.
- Inclusion in the report of data on the number of complaints of the parties against the decisions of the basic and special prosecution, at the Appellate Prosecution, including data on the decisions of the Appellate Prosecution. We emphasize that the DTI for this report has provided fused (joint) statistical data on 3 types of complaints, and not as it should be: for each type separately. In this regard, the DTI has provided the reasoning that the CMIS and the Appellate Prosecution Book did not divide the types of complaints of the parties: 1) Complaint against the dismissal of the criminal report, 2) Complaint against the suspension of the investigation and 3) Complaint against the failure of the prosecutor to take action within 6 months.

Before the removal of the four Drug offenses, there were 1174 cases (*PP 1132 and PPN 42*), with 1596 persons (*PP 1535 and PPN 61*), while after the removal of the four criminal offenses there remained 199 cases (*PP 196 and PPN 3*) with 217 people (*PP 214 and PPN 3*). We find that 975 or 83% of cases have left the group of drugs (*936 PP and 39 PPN*), and 1379 or 86% of persons (*PP 1321 and PPN 58*).

We emphasize that this six-month report (January-June2024), on the characteristic criminal offenses of the ITM, is owned by the founding partners, including the reporting entities, prosecution offices and courts. Therefore, as such, this report contains only the descriptive and not the analytical aspect. We emphasize that the annual reports and multi-year summary reports contain analysis, and that only for the work of the prosecution offices and not of other actors of the ITM.

PART ONE

GENERAL DATA

GROUPS OF CHARACTERISTIC CRIMINAL OFFENCES OF INTER-INSTITUTIONAL TRACKING MECHANISM

I. CRIMINAL REPORTS FILED BY PUBLIC BODIES AND INDIVIDUALS

The submitting entities of criminal reports during the period January-June 2024 have filed, in the prosecution, 560 new cases, with 1103 persons involved in the characteristic criminal offenses of the Inter-Institutional Tracking Mechanism (*figure 1*).

II. STATUS AND TREATMENT OF CRIMINAL REPORTS

From the past periods, 1430 PP cases with 3190 persons have been inherited/CARRIED, 560 new cases with 1103 persons have been received, while 37 cases with 46 persons have passed from the PPN registry to the PP registry. Out of a total of 2027 cases with 4339 persons, the prosecution offices have processed 555 cases with 1096 persons, while at the end of the reporting period 1472 PP cases with 3243 persons remained unprocessed (fig.2 reflects the offenses, while fig. 3 reflects prosecutions).

III. THE WAY OF PROCEEDING OF PERSONS IN CRIMINAL REPORTS

Prosecutions during the period January-June 2024 have processed the cases of 1096 persons involved in characteristic criminal offenses. For 22% of the persons the criminal reports were dismissed, for 20% of the persons the investigations were terminated, for 57% of the persons the indictments were filed, while for 1% of the persons the procedure was joined (fig.4 reflects the offenses, while fig. 5 *reflects prosecutions*

IV. COMPLAINTS OF THE PARTIES IN THE APPELLATE PROSECUTION

The Appellate Prosecution has received 384 complaints of the parties, of which: 12% were dismissed, 40% were rejected, 23% were approved, while 25% are in the process (fig.6 reflects the offenses, while fig. ² 7 *reflects prosecutions*)

² The DTI has provided only the total amount of complaints generated by CMIS, without division/categorization according to the decision to dismiss, suspend or fail prosecutors to take action within 6 months. In relation to this the Acting Chief State Prosecutor on 14.02.2023 issued Instruction A.nr.42/2023 for the procedures of action in the case of reviewing appeals against the decisions of the basic and special prosecutions in the Appellate Prosecutor's Office. Furthermore, in point 11 of the Instruction, the Appellate Prosecutor's Office is obliged to keep a separate register related to the registration and processing of complaints received by the basic and special prosecutor's offices.

V. DECISIONS/ACTIONS OF THE PROSECUTIONS

Prosecutions have taken 577 actions/decisions in the framework of handling the cases of persons involved in characteristic criminal offenses of the inter-institutional tracking mechanism. The courts have approved 51 or 67% of the 76 requests for assignment of detention (fig.8 reflects the offenses, while fig. *9 reflects prosecutions*)

- 15% of the accused were released,
- For 4% of the accused rejected the indictment (*fig.10 reflects the offenses, while fig. 11 reflects prosecutions*)

VII. APPEALS OF THE PROSECUTIONS

Prosecutors have filed 85 appeals to the Court of Appeals against sentencing decisions or for other reasons. The courts have approved 16 or 26% of the complaints, while they have rejected 46 or 74% of the complaints (*fig.12 reflects the offenses, while fig. 13 reflects prosecutions*)
